

- The CoC's mission is to make homelessness in Pinellas County rare, brief, and a one-time experience




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# **Pinellas CoC Membership**

# **County Health Program**



### **Objectives**

- Reduce health disparities in Pinellas County
- Continuity of care
- Improved health outcomes for the uninsured
- Emergency room diversion

# Services are provided in partnership with the Florida Department of Health to:

- Provide prevention-focused health care
- Coordinate patient health care needs and referrals for specialty care

# **Medical Home Model**





- Promotes healthy lifestyle and ongoing prevention
- Team approach to healthcare
- All client services provided at their assigned medical home
- Clients, doctors, and medical staff get to know one another better
- Medical providers receive the opportunity to get to know and understand client specific needs
- Fosters continuity of care

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# Pinellas County Health Program (PCHP)



### **Eligibility:**

- 1. Proof of Identity
- 2. Age (18-64)
- 3. Residency
- 4. Citizenship
- 5. Income (at or below 100% FPL)
- 6. Assets
- 7. Rule Out Alternative Health Benefits


### **Enrollment Term:**

 12 months, with an opportunity to renew enrollment each year.

### **Accessing Services:**

• Four (4) DOH Clinics





# **Health Care for the Homeless (HCH)**





Provides basic primary medical care and related services to individuals experiencing homelessness and living in Pinellas County.

### **Eligibility Requirements**

- 1. Residency or Proof of Homelessness (can be self-declaration)
- 2. Age (18-64)
- 3. Rule Out Private Insurance (Clients who have Medicaid or Medically Needy may still be eligible for limited services)

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# **Health Program Services**



- Primary medical care (referrals for Specialty Care approved providers)
- Cancer screening
- Wellness and prevention services (e.g., annual physical, nutrition education and counseling, etc.)
- Physical therapy
- Mental health and substance abuse services
- Pharmacy services
- Referral for dental services (e.g., prevention and restorative care)
- Lab and medical services (e.g., pap smears, PSA blood levels, urine analysis including pregnancy test, general X-rays, ultrasounds, MRIs, CT scans, and mammograms).
- Case management services
- Telehealth available for some services
- Bus pass for medical appointments



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# **Bayside Health Clinic is Growing**





# **Mobile Medical Unit MMU**





### **Mobile Medical Unit**

Provides basic medical services to include treatment of illness or injury, preventive care, education, limited prescription coverage and referrals for lab work, specialty care, dental and behavioral health.

The unit travels countywide to shelters, drop-in centers, substance abuse treatment facilities and other sites to assist individuals experiencing homelessness.

- Have a disabling condition that impedes one's ability to work one (1) or more years; or have terminal illness



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### Homelessness and Health

- Inadequate access to affordable housing can lead to housing insecurity, which
  causes stress and material hardship, both of which can lead to adverse health
  outcomes. Conversely, poor health can result in high medical bills and lost income,
  thereby leading to housing insecurity.
- Compared to low-income populations with housing, people experiencing homelessness have a higher prevalence of acute and chronic physical and mental health conditions and higher mortality rates.
- Research has shown that homeless adults experience accelerated aging, with premature onset of chronic medical conditions, functional and cognitive impairments, and high rates of age-adjusted mortality.
- People experiencing homelessness sometimes report that health crises, either their own or those of a household member, precipitated their housing loss, in many cases indirectly through income loss.



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### St. Vincent DePaul

### Description

- Short term emergency housing for veterans who are homeless in Pinellas County. Veterans must be working on a specific plan to regain stable housing and income during their stay.
- Walk in Screening Hours Mon-Friday
   10am 2pm
- 401 15<sup>th</sup> St N, St Pete, FL
- Length of stay 30 days
- 20 VA contract beds

Requirements

- Accepts male veterans who meet criteria
- NO income limit and NO charge to the Veteran to participate
- Veteran must be able to care for self
- Meals are provided, laundry available
- · Low Demand Model of Care

### Severe Chronic Mental Illness (SCMI) HCHV Contract

### Description

- Housed at Homeless Emergency Project (HEP)
  - 1120 N Betty Lane, Clearwater •
- 24 Bed transitional housing and treatment for Veterans with serious mental illness
- · Length of stay 90 days
- · Must be capable of self care

### Description

- Refer through a VA Homeless provider
- Must be willing to participate in case management

VETERANS HEALTH ADMINISTRATION

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### Safe Haven Low Demand HCHV Contract

### Description

- Originally a pilot program designed to target difficult to engage Veterans
- · Contracted with Boley Centers
  - · Morningside, Seminole, FL
- 20 bed facility
- · Low demand environment
- Provides residential stability- up to 6 month length of stay

### Requirements

- Must be chronically homeless have serious mental health condition and/or a substance use disorder
- Must be capable of self care
- Referral Process

  Refer through VA homeless Liaison

### Salvation Army: Bradenton

### Description

- A short term housing for homeless Requirements Veterans. Veterans must be working on a specific plan to regain \* stable housing and income during their stay.

- Accepts male and female Veterans who meet the criteria.

- All meals provided and rooms are fully furnished.
- Low Demand Shelter

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# **Mission**

The mission of the "HEP Dental Clinic is to provide free, quality, comprehensive dental services to uninsured/underinsured homeless and at-risk individual residing at HEP, and our community partners regardless of their ability to pay.

# Vision

Individuals experiencing homelessness in our community have access to comprehensive dental services, thereby decreasing use of the emergency room for dental visits, reducing oral health disparities, and improving quality of life.

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We treat those who are:

200% below poverty level and with - out dental insurance.

Out clients are those that reside at HEP and referred to us by the County and Clearwater Free Clinic that meet eligibility.



We have over 20 volunteer dentist, 2 hygienist, students and 5 outside partnerships that assist with providing full comprehensive dental care.
